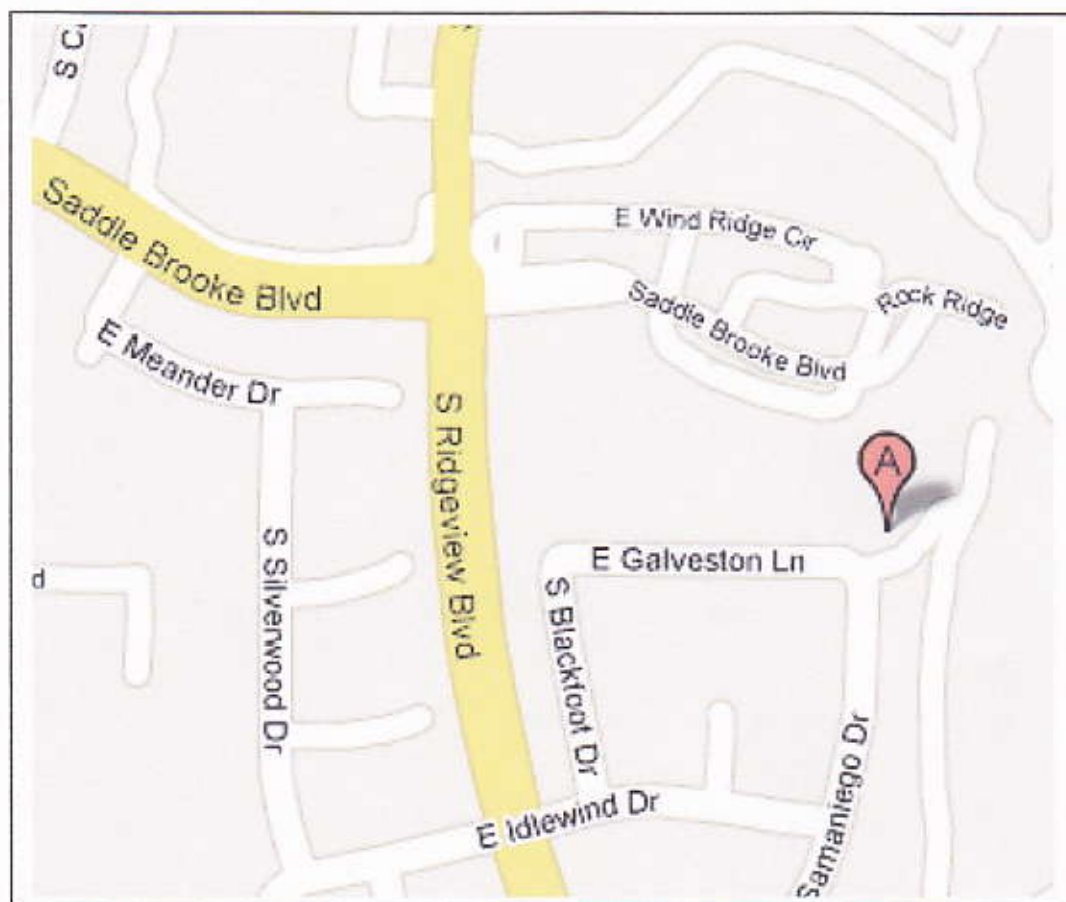

COUSINS

If you are using a recent version of Family Tree Maker, in the Person>Family view, you can establish yourself as the "home person" by right clicking on your name and then clicking on "set as home person." Then, whenever you bring any name into the "root position" (left-most block in the pedigree chart), the relationship of the "root person" to the "home person" will show up in the upper right-hand corner of the screen.

As an example, you may find that you are the fourth cousin twice removed of someone in your database. If you want to find out exactly what that means, go to <http://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/Cousin>. This is a website where you can find out everything you wanted to know about cousins and a lot more. This website was brought to my attention by Dennis Holt.
